Queens Road Academy PE Kit

Having the correct PE Kit for Queens Road Academy, ensures that pupils are appropriately ready and organised for their PE sessions. The PE Kit for Queens Road is as follows:

- Plain red, blue, yellow or green (house colour) T-shirt with a round neck
- Plain navy tracksuit bottoms and/or navy shorts
- Navy sweatshirt
- A pair of trainers or black plimsolls (If plimsolls are worn for PE, comfortable black school shoes/trainers should be worn for the rest of the day)
- Hair must be tied back in order to prevent entanglement in apparatus and to prevent it obscuring vision.
- All jewellery must be removed for PE earring/s cannot be covered up, they must be removed

Swimming kit for Queens Road is:

- Towel
- Swimming costume/trunks
- Hair **must** be tied back in order to prevent entanglement and to prevent it obscuring vision.
- All jewellery must be removed for swimming earring/s cannot be covered up, they must be removed

If children forget their kits, parents will be contacted (where possible) ahead of the PE lesson, which will generally be in the afternoon.

Jewellery Notes:

No jewellery should be worn in school; however children may wear a watch and a pair of plain studs to school if they have pierced ears. However, these MUST be removed for any sport or physical activity undertaken in school. **No member of staff** is permitted to remove a child's earrings so children must be able to remove their own earrings. It is advisable for children to have a small keepsake box, or similar, in their PE bags for them to keep their earrings safe upon removing them. Wearing plasters or tape over the earrings is not permitted.

In the event of a pandemic/epidemic (e.g. Covid-19), we do not require PE kit to be brought into school. We do ask that you choose suitable footwear for your child which they are safe to run and play in. As a result, the expectation on school uniform footwear will be relaxed.
